Smoke Free Multiple Unit Housing Policies

Smoke free multi-unit housing (MUH) policies can have an impact on all tenets of that premise. Such policies will be helpfully to the people who live in apartments, condos or townhouses. Implementing Smoke Free policies will reduce exposure to second and third hand smoke, reduce the risk of fires, increase the value of the property to landlords, and provide a healthier environment for all the people that live and visit these homes.

The American Lung Association has commented on this topic:

"Secondhand smoke exposure poses serious health threats to children and adults. According to the U.S. Surgeon General, there is no safe level of secondhand smoke exposure. Eliminating indoor smoking is the only way to protect nonsmokers from the harmful effects of tobacco smoke. For residents of multi-unit housing (e.g., apartment buildings and condominiums), secondhand smoke can be a major concern given that it can migrate from other units and common areas and travel through doorways, cracks in walls, electrical lines, plumbing, and ventilation systems."

New Purchased Referred Care Health Benefits Eligibility Cards **Available Beginning August 2017**

Purchased Referred Care (PRC) will begin providing PRC Health Benefits Eligibility Cards to our eligible PRC clients. These cards will help to identify you as eligible for the Purchased Referred Care Health Benefit when receiving services both at United Indian Health Services, and most importantly when receiving approved services at outside specialty provider offices and hospitals.

The front of the PRC card provides your name, member number, and expiration date. It also states PRC is payer of last resort as well as a reminder to notify PRC within 72 hours of emergency services.

The back of the PRC card provides information for both the PRC member and the Provider.

The PRC Health Benefits Eligibility Card will help remind you to:

- 1. Show this card and any other insurance cards when checking in for any health services
- 2. Notify PRC within 72 hours of emergency services
- 3. Provide phone numbers if you have questions
- All services need preauthorization from PRC when accessing PRC services

The PRC Health Benefits Eligibility Card will help outside providers by:

- 1. Providing the PRC address for claims submission
- 2. Providing the PRC Claims fax number
- 3. Providing the PRC phone numbers to verify PRC coverage or if they have questions

This PRC Health Benefits Eligibility Card is not a guarantee of payment. The eligibility expiration date is the date that a new Family Intake form is required by Member Services. A completed (front and back) Family Intake form can be given to PRC, and if complete, a new PRC Health Benefits Eligibility Card will be mailed to you.

Stop by PRC to find out if you are eligible for a PRC Health Benefits Eligibility Card.
